In developing suggested routes to school the State of California Department of Transportation Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, Traffic Control for School Areas has determined standards for signs, markings, signals, crossing supervision, and grade separated crossings. It is the policy of the District to utilize this manual to create suggested routes to schools. Additionally, the District will create a School Pedestrian Safety Committee under the auspices of the Transportation Director on an “as needed” basis for each high school site to identify and outline suggested school routes as per the standards established in the above listed manual. Members of the Committee shall include students, parents, traffic engineers, representatives from local law enforcement and municipal planners, in addition to school staff. Additionally, the School Safety Pedestrian Safety Committee shall make recommendations on proposed improvement projects, notify appropriate authorities regarding school safety issues, review and process requests/concerns and provide pedestrian safety education to students, parents and school representatives as appropriate.</p>
